This revision of the Constitution was accepted as the working Constitution at the Executive Committee meeting held August 14, 1.956 at UCLA. It holds as nearly as possible to the intent of the original Constitution, however, many changes in wording have been made for clarlty.

## CONSTITUETON OF DELTA KAPPA ALPHA 1956 <br> ARTICLE I NAME

Section 1. Name of National
The nane of this honorary and professional Cinema Fraternity shall be DELTA KAPPA ALPHA, representing the three branches of Interest in Cinema: that of the Dramatic (DELTA), the Cinematic (KAPPA), and the Aesthetic (ALPHA).

Section 2. Names of Chapters
Tndividual chapters will be named Alpha, Beta, Gamma, etc., respectively in ascending order of the Greek alphabet, as each chapter becomes a part of the National.

## ART TCLE II PURPOSES

Section 1. Purposes
The purposes of TFLTA KAPPA ALPHA, with the founding chapter at the University of Southern California, shall be:
a. To foster more dramatic, cinematic, and aesthetic interest in the motion picture field;
b. To encourage the dissemination of information about Cinema and to further the development of its possibilities.
c. To coordinate more closely the activities of students of Cinema and professionals in the field.

Section 2. Definition of Cinema
Cinema shall be construed to mean the use of motion pictures as a medium of artistic expression and as an instrument of comunication.

## ARTICLE III <br> NAT IONAL MEMBERSHIP

Section 1. Eligibility for Membership
Membership shall be open to both men and women.
Section 2. Classes of Membership
There shall be three classes of membership: Active, Honorary, and Associate.
a. ACTIVE MEMBERSHIP in the National Chapter sha. 11 be automatically conferred upon active chapter members upon the termination or interruption of academic study. They become subject to National jurisdiction in all matters.
(1) A member shall lose his good standing by failure to pay his dues.
(2) A member shail lose his good standing by failing to adhere to the principles and purposes set forth in this document.
b. HONORARY MEMBERSHIP in the National Chapter may be conferred upon individuals who are outstending in Cinema or allied ficids upon approval by the Executive Council after recommendations by an active chapter and/or a member of the National Chapter.
c. ASSOCTATE MEMBERSHTP in the National Chapter may be conferred upon individuals for outstanding contribution to the advancement of DELTA KAPPA ALPIA upon approval by the Executive Council after recomrendation by an active chapter and/or a member of the National Chapter.

## ARTICLE IV NAT XONAL ELECTIONS KND OFFICERS

Section 1. National Elective officers
Elective Officers of the National Chapter shall be President, Vice-President, Secretary, and Treasurer.
Section 2. Election of National Officers
a. National officers shall be elected annually from alumi members in good standing by written vote.
b. Ballots
(1) Ballots for nomination shall be published two months prior to the election
(2) Ballots for eloctions shall be sent out one month prior to the election date.
(3) A double envelope secret ballot must be signed and postmarked prior to midnight of the election date.
c. Voting system
(1) Each voter shail 1ist his first three choices in order of preference for each elective office.
(2) Points shall be awarded as follows:

(3) The nominee receiving the greatest total number of points shall be the one elected.

Section 3. Election Day
The election day shall be the last Friday in January.
Section 4. Duties of Elective Officers
a. National Chapter President
(1) He sha11 be the presiding officer and the chief coordinator of the fraternity.
(2) He sha11 be the chairman of the Executive Councli, and ex-officio member of National Chapter committees.
(3) He shail appoint committee chairmen.
(4) He shall comply with all the duties of President as set forth in Robert's Rules of Order.
b. National Chapter Vice-President
(1) He sha. 11 assume the office of President in ovent of the President's absence or inabllity to act.
(2) He shail comply with all the duties of VicePresident as set forth in Robert's Rules of Order.
c. National Chapter Secretary
(1) He shall issue notices given out by the National Chapter and shall advise affiliated chapters of these declarations.
(2) He shall keep a record of all executive minutes and official records of the National Chapter.
(3) He shall comply with all the duties of Secretary as set forth in Robert ${ }^{\circ}$ s Rules of Order.
(1) He shall keep records of business transactions in connectil on with the National Chapter.
(2) He shall make an annual financial report to the membership.
(3) He sha. 11 comply with all the duties of Treasurer as set forth in Robert's Rules of Order.

## ART TCLE V <br> EXECUTIVE COUNCIL

## Section 1. Membership

2. The Erecutive Council is composed of the elected National Chapter officers.

## Section 2. Duties

The Erecutive Council shail act on a11 matters concerning the National Chapter.

Section 3. Veto
a. The Executive Council can veto action of Active Chapters.
b. Appea.
(1) An appeal from this decision can be obtained by a. two-thirds ( $2 / 3$ ) majority vote of the combined membership of all Active Chapters of DELTA KAPPA ALPHA.
(2) The appeal must then be presented to a.11 members of the National Chapter for a vote.
(3) The Executive Council must initiate action within sixty (60) days of the appea1.
(4) The appeal can be denied by a majority vote of the National membership who cast ballots.

ARTTCLE VI
DUES, FEES, AND ASSESSMENTS
(NATTONAL CHAPTER)
Section 1. Dues
Dues sha11 be three dollars ( $\$ 3.00$ ) per year, and shall be payable within thirty (30) days of the date due.
(1) Actlve Members shall be chosen from regularly enrolled students of Cinema at a duly recognized University or College.
(2) Qualified persons of other departments or divisions may be considered for membership.
(3) Election to Active Membership shall be in accordance with the restrictions set forth in Section 3 of this Article.
b. Inactive Members
(1) Any member who dies not comply with all the rules of the fraternity shall be considered an Inactive Member.
(2) Any member who wishes to withdraw his active participation from the chapter shall be considered an Inactive Nember.
c. Associate Members
(1) Associate Members may be chosen from the faculty or lecture staff of the University or College where the Active Chapter is located.
(2) Upon approval by a majority vote of the active membership, persons outside the University making outstanding contributions to the advancement of DELAA KAPPA ALPHA may be admitted as Associate Nembers.

Section 3. New Members
New members shal be recommended from approved students after the first six (6) weeks of each school term. Their memberships are subject to the following:
a. Each Active Chapter has the sole right to choose its members.
b. Each prospective member must comply with all fraternity rules.
c. Each prospective member shall submit for chapter approval, tangible evidence, in film or document, demonstrating interest, aptitude, and promise of achlevement in ctiema.
d. The negative vote of three (3) active members shal1 be required to bar a prospective member.

Section 2. Fees and Assessments
No fees or assessments shall be levied.

## ART TCLE VII <br> ACT IVE CHAPTER FORMAT ION

## Section 1. Chapter Location

An Active Chapter may be formed only within a duly recognized University of College.

## Section 2. Chapter Members

A group requesting a charter from the National Chapter for formation of an Active Chapter must consist of at least five (5) members.

Section 3. Faculty Sponsor and College Approval
The potential Active Chapter must have the approval of the 1ocal University or College administration. It must have an appointed facuity sponsor who will actively participate as Chapter Advisor in the event that the potential Active Chapter gains recognition from the National Chapter.
Section 4. Recognition Procedure
In order to gain recognition from the National Chapter, a potential Active Chapter must make application to the National Chapter by completing a designated form.
Section 5. Chapter Fee and Charter Membership Fee
A chapter fee of twenty-five dol1ars ( $\$ 25.00$ ) plus one dollar ( $\$ 1.00$ ) per charter member, must be paid in fuil to the National Chapter prior to institution of the new Active Chapter. This fee entities the organizing chapter to the charter of recognition and to individual scrolls for the charter members.

Section 6. Insignia and Credentials
The official DELTA KAPPA ALPHA black and gold insignia and credentials tust be purchased through the National Chapter.

## ARTICLE VIIT <br> ACT TVE CHAPTET MEMBERSHIP

Section 1. Eligibility for Membership
Merabership shail be open to both men and women.
Section 2. Classes of Membership
There shall be three (3) classes of membership: Active, Inactive, and Associate.

## (ACTIVE CHAPTERS)

Section 1. Active Members
Dues for Active Members sha .11 be five dollars $(\$ 5.00$ ) per year, of which one dollar $(\$ 1,00)$ shall be forwarded to the National Chapter.

Section 2. Associate Members
Associate members shall pay no dues, but an initiation fee must be paid.

Section 3. Fees and Assessments.
Upon majority approval by the active membership, special fees or assessments may be levied.

## ARTICLE X <br> ACTIVE CHAPTER OFFICERS

Section 1. Active Chapter Elective Officers
Elective officers of Active Chapters shall be President, Vice-President, Secretary, and Treasurer.
a. Officers shall have been members of DELTA KAPPA ALPHA for at least one (1) academic semester.
b. Officers shall be elected at the end of each academic semester for the following semester.
c. Officers shall be eligible for reelection.

Section 2. Duties of Officers
a. Active Chapter President
(1) The President shall be the chief executive of his chapter.
(2) The President shall act as Chairman of the Executive Council.
(3) The President is empowered to call into session the Executive Council or the active membership to determine policy or special expenditures.
(4) The President shall make available reports of the officers of the Executive Council at his discretion
(5) The President shall comply with all the duties of the President as set forth in Robert's Rules: of Order, and/or as prescribed in the By-Laws of the chapter.
b. Vice-President
(1) The Vice-President shall temporarily discharge the duties of the President in case the President is incapacitated or recalled by the membership.
(2) The Vice-President shall comply with all the duties of Vice-President as set forth in Robert's Rules of Order, or as prescribed in the By-Laws of the chapter.
c. Secretary
(1) The Secretary shall keep the official minutes of a11 chapter meetings.
(2) The Secretary shall supervise the preparation of a11 correspondence affecting the chapter activities.
(3) The Secretary shall comply with all the duties of Secretary as set forth in Robert's Rules of Order, or as prescribed in the By-Laws of the chapter.
d. Treasurer
(1) The Treasurer shall keep the official records of of all monetary business transacted in connection with the Active Chapter.
(2) The Treasurer shall comply with all the duties of Treasurer as set forth in Robert's Rules of Order, or as prescribed in the By-Laws of the chapter.

ARTICLE XI
FACULTY ADVISOR

## Section 1. Duties

a. The Faculty Advisor shall perform duties as the name implies.
b. The Faculty Advisor shall serve as liaison between the Active Chapter and the institution where the chapter is located.
c. The Faculty Advisor shall be a men ber of the Executive Council.

## Section 2. Vote

The Faculty Advisor shall have no vote.

## ART TCLE XII ACTIVE CHAPTER EXECUTIVE COUNCIL

Section 1. Composition of Executive Council
The Executive Council shall be composed of the elected and appointed officers of the Active Chapter and the Faculty Advisor.

Section 2. Duties of Executive Council
a. The Executive Council may initiate action or pre-determine policy for approval by the active membership.
b. The members of the Executive Council shall make their reports of their offices or committees to the President in meetings of the Executive Council in lieu of such reports at meetings of the active membership.

ARTICLE XIII
ACTIVE CHAPTER ANNOAL REFORT
Section 1: Report to National Chapter
Active Chapters shall report annually to the National Chapter the activities and achievements of the chapters and/or their individual members.

ART ICLE XIV
ACTIVE CHAPTER RTGHTS
Section 1. Active Chapter By-Laws
Active Chapters may draw up individual sets of By-Laws to augment this Constitution. Such By-Laws must be ratified by the National Executive Council before they become effective.

Section 2. Method of Appeal
Active Chapters may appeal from the veto of the National Executive Council by a two-thirds (2/3) majority vote of the combined membership of all Active Chapters of DELTA KAPPA ALPHA.

ARTICLE XY
AMENDMENTS TO THE NATTONAL CONSTITUTION
Section 1. Limitations of Amendments
Any article, section, or paragraph thereof contained in this Constitution may be amended.

Section 2. Introduction of Amendments
a. Amendments may be proposed by any chapter or by the National Executive Council.
b. The proposed amendment must be submitted in whiting to the National Executive Council for initiation of action.
c. The National Executive Council must initiate action within sixty (60) days.

Section 3. Voting on Amendments
Every chapter sha11 vote on the proposed amendment. A twothirds approval vote of the combined membership of all Active Chapters, plus a majority vote of the membership of the National Chapter, is required to make the proposed amendment a. part of this Constitution.
a. If the majority of the members in a chapter vote for approval, then the chapter as a whole stands for approval.
b. If the National Executive Council approves the proposed amendment, a special ballot containing the proposed amendment shall be circulated to the entire membership. Ballots must be signed and postmarked prior to mionight of the deadine date noted within the ballot.

Section 4. Scope of Approved Amendments
Any amendment to the Constitution automaticaliy aulifies the original article, section, or paragraph thereof which it replaces, and no other.

## ART TCLE XVI <br> ROBERTTS RULES OF ORDER

Section 1. Normal Proceedings
A11 business shall be conducted according to the procedures set forth in Robert's Rules of Order.
Section 2. Unspecified Proceedings
Any policies, proceedings, duties, etc., not contained in this document shall be governed by those set forth in Robert's Rules of Order.
