Proposed National By-Laws

ARTICLE I

Fees and Assessments

SECTION 1. Each chapter shall submit annually on March 1st (first) a roster of active members, plus a separate list of those completing or terminating their education. Chapters may establish reasonable dues and fees in conjunction with the national fee.

SECTION 2. The fee for life membership shall be twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) when paid as an active member and fifty dollars (\$50.00) when paid as an alumni member.

SECTION 3. Each alumni member of the fraternity shall pay an annual due of three dollars (\$3.00).

ARTICLE II

National Membership

SECTION 1. Membership in the national chapter is automatically conferred on active local chapter members upon termination of education or graduation and payment of \$3.00 due.

ARTICLE III

Chapter Membership

SECTION 1. Candidates for membership in the fraternity must designate above average achievement in college work, promise for future cinema work, or equivalent professional achievement.

SECTION 2. Candidates for membership must place a major emphasis in their college work in the area of cinema.

SECTION 3. Each chapter shall determine the particulars regarding its own qualifications for membership and determine its own procedures.

SECTION 4. Each chapter shall have the power to suspend any of its members for just cause and shall determine its own procedures for such suspension.

ARTICLE IV

Chapters

SECTION 1. Chapters shall have their own by-laws designating the procedures of operation for the chapter, the chapter's officers and their duties. Chapter by-laws shall not conflict with the National Constitution and By-Laws.

SECTION 2. Chapters shall submit their by-laws to the National Executive Board for approval.

SECTION 3. Collegiate chapters shall meet at least once a month during the academic year.

ARTICLE V

Petitioning Groups

SECTION 1. A petitioning group shall submit the following information with a formal petition for a charter to the National Executive Board:

- a. Name of college and size of regular enrollment.
- b. Size of department or division of cinema.

- c. Name of petitioning group and its history if it has been a functioning organization before petitioning.
- d. List activities carried on by the group while preparing to petition Delta Kappa Alpha.
- e. Complete outline of proposed program and objectives for the chapter during its first year in Delta Kappa Alpha.
- f. Copy of proposed by-laws.
- g. Financial condition of the group.
- h. Reasons for wishing to affiliate with Delta Kappa Alpha.
- i. Approval of the faculty and administration by signature of executive officer of the institution or his representative.
- j. Size of group wishing to become active chapter.

SECTION 2. A petitioning group shall submit any further information the National Executive Committee shall request.

ARTICLE VI

Records

A permanent record of all active, honorary and alumni members of each chapter shall be kept on file by the national office and a duplicate record in the chapter. The record shall include a personal history and permanent address.

ARTICLE VII

National Office

The National Office of Delta Kappa Alpha shall be located at a place decided upon by the National Executive Board.

ARTICLE VIII

Definitions

SECTION 1. Cinema shall mean the use of motion pictures as a medium of artistic expression and as an instrument of communication.

SECTION 2. In good standing shall mean a duly initiated member who has paid all of his financial obligations and fulfilled his obligations to the organization as a fully participating and active member.

SECTION 3. Life Membership shall mean a member who has paid the Life Membership fee. Life Members do not pay any further fees or dues.

ARTICLE IX

Amendments

SECTION 1. Amendments to the National By-Laws shall be made by a major vote of National Membership.
