Dear Doug:

As you well know we are in the process of re-activating the national office of DKA. We have started an ambitious program including the publication of a Newsletter four times this year. All of this is fairly costly and we are in need of all of the economic support we can get.

According to the records (and recollections of several of us), about January 1951 there were two checking accounts at the Security-First National Bank, one for Alpha and one for National. The National account was inactive and being decreased by charges each month and there was also considerable embarrassment and confusion due to the fact that deposits and withdrawals were getting mixed up. As a result the money from National was merged with that of Alpha. According to the last statement I can find for the old National account (which is enclosed) the amount was about \$22.27.

It would be most helpful if this money could now be returned to the National Treasury to help with the cause.
